STATEMENT OF INTENT TO REGISTER

Students must submit a SIR by <u>June 1st, 2023</u>. The SIR can be submitted to UCSB through your UCSB Portal. If you choose to come here, please know that a \$250 fee will be required and is non-refundable. Some students may be eligible for fee waiver or a fee deferral that can be covered by your financial aid. If you choose not to come here, that is completely okay, but please let us know by declining the SIR!



UCSB NETID

You can create your UCSB netID within your UCSB Portal under "identity manager." Your UCSB netID will be required in order to register for transfer orientation and your future courses at UCSB. Your UCSB netID will also be required when filling out your housing application, submitting student health records, and applying for financial assistance. It takes about a week for accounts to process so the sooner you can create an account the better!

FINANCIAL AID

You can review your financial aid award letter inside of your UCSB Portal. This award letter will inform you how much financial assistance you will receive from UCSB. Students who choose to attend UCSB will also be able to apply for additional scholarships, grants, loans and/or work study to help with their financial needs. Be sure to weigh all of your financial aid options equally before submitting your SIR to any UC campus.

ORIENTATION

Sign up for Transfer Orientation to meet with your major department advisors this fall! Registering for Transfer Orientation will give you the opportunity to discuss your next academic steps at UCSB so you can stay ahead. You can register for Transfer Orientation through your UCSB Portal. Please know that Transfer Orientation is not required, but highly recommended. A UCSB netID will be required to register.

HOUSING

Want to live on campus? The undergraduate apartments are a perfect fit for recently admitted transfer students. The housing application can be found within your UCSB applicant portal underneath the "Next Steps" tab. Living on campus is optional and not mandatory. UCSB netID will be required for housing application.

STUDENT HEALTH

UCSB offers medical services, behavioral health, sexual and reproductive health, alcohol and drug programs, and pharmacy support for all of our students! Students can enroll in UCSB insurance or stay with their original health plan (if eligible). View Student Health inside your UCSB applicant portal to see which documents you may have to submit to UCSB prior to the beginning of fall term. UCSB netID will be required.

ACADEMIC ADVISING

Between now and fall, you may have specific questions about selecting courses for summer and fall. The Office of Admissions is unable to provide academic advising for UCSB students. We strongly recommend you attend Orientation this summer for this reason.



TRANSFER SUMMER

Did you know that you can get started on your graduation requirements from UCSB as early as this summer?
