Established in 1970, the Chicana/o Studies Department was the first unit in the entire UC system. Student activism strengthened the Department over time, leading to the creation of the world's first doctoral program in Chicana/o Studies in 2003.

Each cultural center is located at the Student Resource Building (SRB), in addition to other departments, such as the Office of Black Student Development, Women's Center, Campus Learning Assistance Services, and more. Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) services all students while focusing on income eligible and firstgeneration undergraduates. EOP provides social/cultural programming, one-on-one counseling and advising, campus support referrals, and prepares students for their career postgraduation. **eop.sa.ucsb.edu** The Poverty, Inequality and Social Justice minor provides students with the tools to understand the structural and political roots, dynamics and consequences of poverty and intersectional inequality; conduct original research; and engage in efforts to address poverty through policy, practice and social action.
